# **GRADE 4**

### **Group A**

Scales (80 bpm)

Candidates must play all five scale types listed, and from each of the starting notes stated (16 in total)

Each scale prepared on starting notes A, B, C and D.

- 1. Natural minor

- 3. Blues

Each scale prepared on starting notes F and Bb

- 1. Major
- 2. Major pentatonic

Arpeggios (80 bpm)

Candidates must play all three arpeggio types listed, and from each of the four starting notes A, B, C and D (12 in total)

- 2. Minor
- 3. Dominant 7th

- 4. Minor pentatonic
- 5. Blues
- 6. Harmonic minor

# **GRADE 6**

### **Group A**

Modes

One octave Tempo: 100 bpm

Candidates must play both modes from each of the four starting notes E, F, G and A (8 in total). Both fingerings should be presented.

- 1. Dorian
- 2. Mixolydian

### **Group B**

Scales

Over a 10th/11th (see Grade Book) Tempo: 100 bpm

- 1. G minor pentatonic (5 positions)
- 2. B minor pentatonic (5 positions)

### **Group C**

**Arpeggios** 

One octave Tempo: 100 bpm

Candidates must play both arpeggios from each of the four starting notes E, F, G and A (8 in total)

- 1. Minor7b5
- 2. Diminished

### **Group D**

Chords

Candidates must play all chords from both two starting notes F and G (4 in total)

- 1. Dominant7th
- 2. Minor7th

### **Group E**

Stylistic Study (played to backing track)

Candidates to perform one technical study from the list below:

Example 1 – Rock / Metal: Sixteenth note fingerstyle grooves and legato

Example 2 – Funk: Slap and pop playing and percussive 16th note fingerstyle

Example 3 – Jazz/Latin/Blues: **Chords and Upper Register** playing

















# **GRADE 7**

### **Group A**

Modes

One octave Tempo: 100 bpm

Candidates must play the following modes and scale from each of the four starting notes F, Bb, D and Eb on the E string (24 in total). Both fingerings should be presented.

- 1. Lydian (one octave)
- 2. Phrygian (one octave)
- 3. Jazz melodic minor (one octave)

### **Group B**

Scales Two octaves Tempo: 100 bpm

1. G major

### **Group C**

**Arpeggios** One octave Tempo: 100 bpm

Candidates must play all arpeggios from each of the four starting notes F, Bb, D and Eb (12 in total).

- 1. Major9th
- 2. Minor9th
- 3. Dominant9th

# **Group D**

Chords

Candidates must play all chords from both two starting notes E and A (6 in total).

- 1. Dominant7th
- 2. Major7th
- 3. Minor7th

### **Group E**

Stylistic Study (played to backing track)

Candidates to perform one technical study from the list below:

Example 1 - Rock / Metal: Pedal tones and legato phrasing

Example 2 - Funk: 16th note slap grooves and string crossing

Example 3 – Jazz/Latin/ Blues: Natural harmonics and arpeggios

















# **GRADE 8**

### **Group A**

Scales One octave Tempo: 100 bpm

Candidates must play the following three scales from each of the four starting notes F#/ Gb, G, C#/Db, G#/Ab on the E string and with both fingerings presented (24 in total).

- 1. Whole tone (one octave)
- 2. Diminished (one octave)
- 3. Altered (one octave)

### **Group B**

Scales Two octaves Tempo: 100 bpm

Exercise 4 in the indicated key only.

4. G natural minor

### **Group C**

**Arpeggios** One octave Tempo: 100 bpm

Candidates must play all arpeggios from both two starting notes D and G (8 in total).

- 1. Dominant7#5
- 2. Dominant7b5
- 3. Dominant7#9
- 4. Dominant7b9

### **Group D**

Chords

Candidates must play all chords from each of the four starting F#, G, Db, Ab (12 in total).

- 1. Minor7th
- 2. Major7th
- 3. Dominant7th

### **Group E**

Stylistic Study (played to backing track)

Candidates to perform one technical study from the list below:

Example 1 – Rock / Metal: Odd time grooves and power chords Example 2 – Funk: Syncopation and slap bass technique

Example 3 – Jazz/Latin/Blues: Up tempo fingerstyle technique and walking basslines
